Suggested visits

DAY OF ARRIVAL	Check-in 3.30pm and relax
	Tim & Karen can book you a meal locally from 6pm onwards
	Stretch your legs in <u>Silver Meadows</u>
DAY 2	Depart for Cockermouth around 10am. Head to
	Cockermouth main street where you will find <u>Wordsworth</u> <u>House</u> located at the far end, just before the mini
	roundabout. (Please note that the house is not open on a
	Friday and the first visits start at 11am. Check opening
	times <u>here</u>)
	From Cockermouth, head to Lorton and then over
	Whinlatter Pass. This road descends into Braithwaite and
	then rejoins the A66. Head into Keswick and take the A591
	to Grasmere.
	Dove Cottage & Wordsworth Museum is located on the
	A591 on the outskirts of Grasmere village. (The cottage is undergoing renovations currently so please check the website for details)
	Dinner back in Keswick. We suggest Morrells (booking
	advised) or if you prefer fish & chips, go to the Kingfisher
	located opposite the bookshop just before the mini roundabout.
DAY 3	After breakfast head to Coniston to visit Brantwood
	Head to Keswick then to the A591 to Ambleside. Pick up
	the signs for the A593.
	You can get to the house on the <u>Coniston launch</u>

	Head to Ambleside on the B5285 to Beatrix Potter's farm
	Hill Top at near Sawrey, Hawkshead. It is open until 5pm
	but be aware there is limited parking. You can then visit
	the Beatrix Potter Gallery in Hawkshead.
	Have dinner at the Drunken Duck (booking advised). Head
	to Barnsgate on the B5285. This well-known gastro-pub is
	about 5 miles from Hill Top.
	To get home, you will need to head into Ambleside and
	then back along the A591.
DAY 4	On the way home, call in at <u>Thornthwaite Galleries</u> . Head
	to Keswick on the A66, turning right at the signpost for
	Thornthwaite. Follow this road to village, turning right at
	the bus stop. The road to the gallery is very narrow but
	there is a carpark at the gallery.
	If you would like some lunch before heading to the M6,
	head into Portinscale and follow the road out of the
	village past the Marina and on to Lingholme. There is a
	sighpost for Lingholm Kitchen on the left. You can see
	Peter Rabbit's garden from the huge panoramic window
	as you eat your lunch.
